Council Chair Update

Aloha Central Union Church!

Did you know that October is designated as **Clergy Appreciation Month?** And that this Sunday, October 8, 2023, is Clergy Appreciation Day? I hope

you will join me in showing your appreciation to our Senior Minister, Rev. Rushan Sinnaduray, and to our Associate Minister, Rev. Mary Herbig, not only this Sunday but the entire month of October! A minister friend of mine once said he had the easiest job in the world according to some members of his congregation whose only contact with him was to attend worship service for an hour on Sunday morning. By their reckoning, he worked only one day a week (Sunday), and only half a day at that! My friend was joking, of course, because we all know a minister's job can be as endless as the needs of the congregation. In addition to the more noticeable work of preaching sermons each Sunday and officiating at weddings, baptisms and memorial services that are witnessed by many, our ministers also attend to the spiritual, emotional, and personal needs of hundreds of individuals in our congregation. Indeed, ministry is a demanding and stressful job and, too often, our ministers are taken for granted. So please take time to let Pastor Rushan and Pastor Mary know how much we appreciate them and how blessed we are to have them at Central Union Church. And while you are at it, be sure to congratulate Pastor Mary on her 5th anniversary at Central Union!

October is also the time to start reflecting on stewardship. By now, you should have received your stewardship letter from long-time CUC members, Ruth Chang and Dorothy Craven, who are cochairing this year's stewardship campaign. We are grateful not only for their current leadership but also for the many ways they have contributed to the life of our church over the years. How we steward the resources and gifts God has given Central Union Church is important, but equally important is how we steward the resources and gifts God has given each one of us. The decision to pledge and how much to pledge is a personal matter worthy of reflection and prayer. As you reflect on that decision, I hope you will consider all that God has done in your life, and that pledging is not so much giving of what you have to Central Union Church but returning to God a portion of what God has given to you. Pledging is also very important in that it helps CUC be more purposeful in carrying out God's work – by knowing

how much money is available, we can better plan our church's ministry activities. I invite you to join me in returning your Estimate of Giving Card (to be mailed before the month's end) as soon as possible.

Our first monthly Council meeting with Pastor Rushan was held on September 29, 2023. Allow me to share some news from that meeting:

- Grants: Council member Martha Balkin has been busy writing grants to obtain funds for various Church projects. Because of her efforts, Central Union Church was awarded a \$65,000 grant from the Atherton Family Foundation to fund capital improvement work to Atherton Memorial Chapel.
- Security: To assure the safety of our members, staff, tenants, kūpuna, keiki, visitors, and all others who visit Central Union Church, the Council is undertaking an assessment of security at our two campuses. Leading this endeavor are Council members Martha Balkin and Sam Failla, assisted by staff member Cory Taylor (Facilities & HSE Manager).
- Endowment: A working group has been assembled to conduct a strategic review of the Church's endowment to ensure it is being managed in a manner that will optimize returns within acceptable risk parameters. The group is led by Council member Sarah Nam with the assistance of Council member David Yee and others. The group is working to conclude its review and report to Council by year end.
- Real Estate Committee: Council member (and Chair of the Real Estate Committee) David Yee informed the Council that meetings with potential development partners will commence in October. These meetings are intended to be preliminary in nature, for the purpose of providing potential developers with initial information about CUC's objectives and to determine which developers are interested in further conversations. David reiterated that the Real Estate Committee intends to provide a progress report to the congregation by the end of the year.

The theme was "pili'āina," to have kinship with the land. We paused to acknowledge and appreciate the 'āina where we live, as well as the host culture; to reflect and remember the Hawaiian Kingdom and its queen, Lili'uokalani, who was unjustly imprisoned and whose kingdom was forcibly taken 130 years ago.



Thirty years ago, our denomination, the United Church of Christ, issued an apology to the Hawaiian people acknowledging and confessing the complicity of our predecessors, including leaders from Central Union Church, in the overthrow of the Hawaiian Kingdom. As part of that apology, we committed ourselves to the work of reconciliation.

As we celebrate the abundance, beauty, and grace here in these islands, let us not forget our kuleana (responsibility) to right the wrongs done to this 'āina and its first people.

September 24th was Pastor Rushan's first Sunday in the pulpit! We got to welcome him along with his wife Arushini, son Aran, and daughter Alisha, to Central Union Church!






