

"In Maori culture, the indigenous culture of Aotearoa-New Zealand, new birth is a central motif and it is imaged in the *koru*, the unfurling fern. At the heart of a fern sits a tiny curled frond. With space, it unrolls. Over time, it turns from a light and timid green to a dark, rich emerald. And yet the fern cannot grow unless it has a clear path toward the sun. So the Maori burn off undergrowth in order to encourage new life. The cycles of death and decay are the compost of the new. This is *koru* theology. ...In Christian conversion, a new life unfolds as the Creator continues to birth, form and shape." (pg. 48)
