Central Union Church: Our Purpose and Our Calling

Why are we a church?

Why do we exist?

What is our purpose and our calling?

Would anyone care or notice if Central Union Church ceased to exist?

Have you ever stopped to ask any of those questions?

Matthew, Mark, Luke, John and the book of Acts all have a charge that was given to the Church. In each case it sounds slightly different, but it remains essentially the same. **The church exists to help all people grow in faith and to make disciples.** This is a bold statement.

So often we focus on other things and ignore or forget our primary reason for being. We put so much energy into maintaining traditions, holding on to ministries and programs and groups that no longer work or are irrelevant, resisting change, arguing over minor irrelevancies and fail to focus on our primary purpose for being. This is hard to hear, but the church's primary calling is not to be a social service agency, a babysitting service, a center for social activism, a museum for preserving the past, or even a fellowship group or club.

All these things are important, but the Christian Church primarily exists to help all people grow in faith and to discern for themselves and as the gathered community the ways in which they can put that faith into practice. This is why we want to see people in our church and community grown in their relationship with God and which is why we want to see the lives of individuals and families change for the better as their relationship with God grows wider and deeper. The purpose of every sermon we hear, every book we read and every encounter we have in the scriptures is not simply to give us enough to make it through the day or week ahead. That would mean the whole purpose of the church is to cater to us and to our personal wants and needs. It is not. The purpose is to equip and strengthen us to be Christ's disciples in the world.

Touched by the gospel, we can touch those around us. You see, our life as the gathered people of God is meant to bring the transforming power of Jesus Christ into our world. Our primary purpose as the church is about making disciples who in turn make disciples. It is about being so touched by the reality of God's love, that God's love in us touches others. It is about growing our faith and then helping others grow in their faith.



As we move into the vibrant and spirit-filled future that God has in store for Central Union Church, we will be discerning new ways of being church in our world today and working to develop new and innovative ways of reaching and meeting the needs of our community here in Honolulu, Hawai'i. And we will do the work of discernment together as the people of God in this place through prayer and conversation. And everything we will be doing, everything we will be praying for and talking about, begins and ends with one primary question – "how are we drawing all people into a relationship with Jesus Christ, helping them grow in faith and making disciples?"

Holy Humor



Aloha Central Union Church!

Question: If April showers bring May flowers, what do May flowers bring?

Answer: Pilgrims!

Like me, you probably heard that joke many years ago. Funny how simple jokes like that stick with you. I became interested in humor at a young age; when I was in middle school, I would check out books from the library about humor and then read the jokes, puns, limericks, and funny stories in bed at night before I fell asleep. Back then, one of my favorite humor books was *Laugh Day* by writer and publisher Bennett Cerf. It unlocked for me various forms that humor can take and the dawning realization that laughter, whether it be an outwardly audible reaction or just an inward smile, had a positive impact on my disposition.

Although I did not understand why at the time, scientific data has shown both short-term and longterm health benefits from laughter. In an article entitled "Laughter is the Best Medicine", authors Lawrence Robinson, Melinda Smith, M.A., and Jeanne Segal, Ph.D., report that "laughter is strong" medicine. It draws people together in ways that trigger healthy physical and emotional changes in the body. Laughter strengthens your immune system, boosts mood, diminishes pain, and protects you from the damaging effects of stress. Nothing works faster or more dependably to bring your mind and body back into balance than a good laugh. Humor lightens your burdens, inspires hope, connects you to others, and keeps you grounded, focused, and alert. It also helps you relieve anger and forgive sooner." I was particularly struck by that last part that laughter helps you relieve anger and forgive sooner - because if we truly seek to Embody Christ (as we **Engage** and **Embrace** all), we all need to forgive sooner. If laughter can help us do that, then laughter may truly be the best medicine.

When I heard Pastor Rushan say we were going to celebrate Holy Humor Sunday the week after Easter, my first thought (since I had never heard of Holy Humor Sunday) was Pastor Rushan was playing a joke on us. Then I learned the concept originated centuries ago from the reflections of early church theologians. No doubt they realized intuitively (without the benefit of today's scientific research) the positive benefits of laughter. If our inaugural celebration of Holy Humor Sunday went as well at our other services as it did at the Contemporary service, I hope it will become an annual tradition at Central Union.

In years past, April was always a very busy month for the Council. Church staff, and the Church's various ministries as we prepared for Central Union's annual Member meeting in May (since our Bylaws required the annual Member meeting be held in May each year). However, recent changes made to our Bylaws to synchronize various church events with our new fiscal year calendar resulted in changing Central Union's annual Member meeting requirement to September of each year. Although September is still five months away. I wanted to let you know the date for the annual Member meeting has been set for Sunday, September 8, 2024, so please mark your calendars to be sure you can attend this important meeting. More details about the annual Member meeting will be provided as the date gets closer.

If you have taken the time to read this far, you deserve one last bit of church humor (I shared this joke at the Contemporary service this past Holy Humor Sunday but thought it was worth sharing with those who attended other services): A Sunday school teacher asked his class to draw pictures of their favorite Bible stories. When the class turned in their pictures, the teacher was confused by one young girl's picture which showed four people on an airplane. The teacher asked the girl what biblical story it represented, and she replied, "the flight to Egypt". "I see," said the teacher, "and that must be Mary, Joseph, and the Baby Jesus, but who is the fourth person?" "Oh," the young girl replied, "that is Pontius the Pilot."

As we leave the shadow of the empty tomb and walk out into the resurrection light, let each of us do so with joy in our heart, a smile on our face and laughter on our lips knowing that Christ is risen – He is risen indeed!

March 22: WorldStrides Heritage Festival

This adjudicated choral festival included 309 high school students and 40 middle school students in 12 choirs from CA, HI, KS, NV, and Vietnam. Adjudicators from O'ahu were Mark Conching, director of The Sounds of Aloha Chorus; Dr. Erica Glenn, BYU-HI; and Dr. Alec Schumacker, HPU.



April 5: Choirs of America Nā Leo 'O Hawai'i
