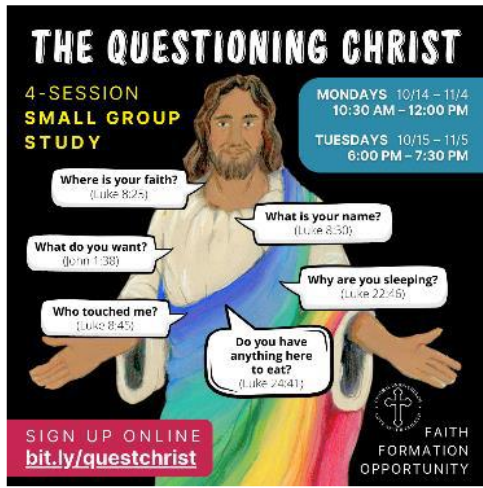
COME, LET US IMAGINE TOGETHER!
