


gathered community. At that gathering, I will also share some of my vision and priorities for Central Union Church for the next 10 years.


### Blessing of Pets

On September 13, Kapi'olani nurses represented by Hawai'i Nurses Association participated in a one-day strike for safer staffing for quality patient care. In the following days, Kapi'olani Medical Center then locked out the nurses and prevented them from returning to work for 22 days. Despite being locked out, the nurses continued to provide care through volunteering at our weekly food distribution. Mahalo! The nurses returned to work on October 6 after union nurses and the hospital officially reached an agreement after a year of negotiations, two strikes, and a lockout.

## Wondering with Godly Play

For three Saturdays in September, members of Central Union Church, Harris United Methodist Church, Halau Wa'a Episcopal Church, and St. Christopher's Episcopal Church gathered at Central Union for Godly Play Storyteller Training. In a total of 24 training hours, we explored the power of story and wondering and practiced our storytelling skills.

During these training days, I began to wonder. I wonder what it would be like if CUC had 10 or 15 or 20 storytellers who took Godly Play into the wider congregation and into our community. I wonder what it would be like if every ministry at CUC had the opportunity to experience Godly Play regularly through trained storytellers in every ministry. I wonder what it would look like if families could experience Godly Play at home. I wonder what it would look like if CUC held two or more trainings every year and could become a resource for other congregations to incorporate Godly Play into their church as well. I wonder what it would look like if every church had the opportunity to have someone in their congregation trained as a Godly Play Storyteller. I wonder...

As we imagine our future together, I envision Godly Play at Central Union reaching beyond the Children's Ministry and beyond our doors, reaching into the wider community. Godly Play is currently being used around the world in settings beyond Children's Ministries. Hospitals, long-term care units, memory care, addiction recovery settings, veterans groups, and prison ministries are just a few places where Godly Play can be found. I imagine Godly Play at CUC reaching into some or all of these areas and connecting people to God through the power of story and wondering. I invite you to join me!

#### Here's how you can help:

- Sign up for our next training event. We are working on holding training again in the spring, so stay tuned!
- **Sponsor a story.** We are working to expand our story collection and create a list of stories still needed. These include the stories of Jacob, Joseph, Esther, Ruth, Abraham, Sarah, Daniel, Isaiah, Jeremiah, and others.
- Invite a storyteller to your gathering. We love to tell stories and would be so happy to share one with a group outside of our regular Sunday mornings!



As we concluded our Godly Play Storyteller Training, many of the participants expressed how Godly Play had touched them in profound ways. I too have found this to be true. I may share stories with children every week, but in the story and wondering, I come closer to God as well. And now, I wonder...

#### Improvements to Atherton Courtyard

Central Union received a matching grant of \$65,000 from the Atherton Foundation to make needed improvements to our Atherton Memorial Chapel ("AMC"). Repairs included repainted interior trim, walls, exterior doors and windows; fixed leaky roof and exterior wall; upgraded toilets and sink fixtures; and new courtyard decking surrounding The Exceptional Monkeypod Tree. The Buildings and Grounds Committee was able to hire a contractor and a certified arborist who successfully removed the deteriorating cement skirting around the tree and replaced it with a more appropriate decking that is safer to use and better protects our tree. It is a beautiful addition to the AMC courtyard along with the strings of lights that now hang above the space. We would like to thank Martha Balkin for submitting the application that resulted in the \$65,000 grant from the Atherton Foundation.
